### **Financial Concerns and the Rabbi**

I want to thank you all for attending our emergency Executive Session at my house on Thursday, March 14. We had a serious discussion and a good outcome. A small group of us met with Rabbi Karol on Monday evening, March 18 at 6:00 pm at my house. The group included Patrick Quinn, Michael Mandel, Cheryl Decker, and me. We presented the Rabbi with a letter and an Addendum to his Contract, proposing that as of January 1, 2020, he move to a half-time role for half-time remuneration. We discussed the situation and outcomes, and the Rabbi was amenable to our proposals. He called Rhonda, and she suggested that they mull it over for 24 hours. On Tuesday, the Rabbi contacted us and said he would accept our Addendum and terms. A letter was written and will be sent to the congregation, signed by the Rabbi and me. We are prepared to send the letter out immediately. At our May 9 Annual Meeting, we will briefly address the changes to the congregation, due to the financial situation, and let them know that the Board made a fiduciary decision to maintain a Rabbi and to save some funds at the same time. It was the best decision we could make, considering the financial position we are in. We will also be creating a Transition Committee that will include the Rabbi and help us move forward.
