Message from Rabbi Karol



What I learned and experienced at the Union for Reform Judaism Biennial Convention in Chicago, Illinois on December 11-15, 2019

Temple Beth-El is part of a much larger community which is hard to imagine within the confines of our own congregational building. I have attended all of the biennial conventions beginning with 1987. The sheer number of attendees always has impressed me. Nothing in the Jewish communal world has matched, for me, the sound of 5000 people singing the Shema at the Friday evening service or revisiting popular Jewish songs and worship tunes at the song session later the same night.

The large number of attendees does prevent a participant from seeing people he or she knows. One delegate from Bellingham, Washington, who lived in Las Cruces some 30 years ago (we met quite randomly at the 2011 biennial), saw me on Thursday and said to me, "Why did it take us a full day to see each other?" One of the first people I saw this year was a member of my youth group and a fellow student at my high school. I had a chance to reconnect with two college contemporaries who sang in the Hillel Foundation choir I helped to direct. On the last night, I passed by the delegation from my home Temple where I grew up, trying to take a photo by the "leaf" with their congregation's name. I offered to be the photographer, and then I met the youngest member of the delegation, a college student whose mom and grandparents I knew. That was yet another demonstration of "from generation to generation." I saw congregants from the Temple I served in Dayton, Ohio, who knew both Rhonda and me as young Jewish professionals. The Karol delegation was completed by our niece Samantha Tananbaum, who works in social media Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion. Many of my rabbinic and Jewish music colleagues were there as well.

With every conversation I had, TBE Las Cruces found its way onto the American Jewish map for my fellow delegates.

The sessions I attended conveyed many pearls of wisdom. Rabbi Shmuly Yanklowitz, author of *Pirkei Avot:* A Social Justice Commentary, lamented how empathy has lost its place as an important value, and encouraged us to uphold respect and to stand for what we believe in an authentic way. Rabbi Ariel Burger, author of Witness: Lessons from Elie Wiesel's Classroom, noted that Elie Wiesel taught that education, coupled with memory, can enable people to stop themselves from committing atrocities of the likes that Wiesel saw during his lifetime. On Shabbat afternoon, I attended a session with Marc Freedman, author of How to Live

Forever, and Laura Geller, co-author (with her late husband Richard Siegel) of Getting Good at Getting Older. Marc Freedman noted that loneliness is the single greatest threat to our well-being, at any age. Laura Geller encouraged us to LIVE a legacy, rather than just think about leaving a legacy. In an address to the convention gathering on Saturday night, Professor Deborah Lipstadt gave an excellent talk on how we should not let anti-Semitism define us, urging us to be the subjects of our Jewish identity, in control of our expression, rather than seeing ourselves as objects of scorn and hatred. In other words, our Judaism should be about JOY and not OY.

I had the opportunity to hear many enjoyable performances of Jewish music, including Julie Silver (who visited us this past May), Dan Freelander and Jeff Klepper (creators of the "Shalom Rav" melody we sing), and many others. I heard many of the melodies we sing at Temple Beth-El dur-

ing worship and other programs throughout the biennial.

Delegates had a chance to visit famous Chicago sites on organized tours (my choice was Wrigley Field), which offered an opportunity for us to explore common interests beyond our commitment to sustaining our congregations back home.

The URJ biennial has the potential to strengthen the foundation of our wisdom about Jewish life and to foster connections with the greater Jewish world. One of my music colleagues who attended for the first time said that there was no convention she had attended quite like this one. I urge Temple Beth-El members to consider participating in this gathering so that you too, can bring back home the special spirit of the URJ community.

While I hesitate to go into specifics, measures have been taken to secure our classrooms and the different areas of TBE. In addition two, large first aid-kits have been installed in additional areas of our building along with other first-aid items, Thanks to Mark Saltman for heading this effort and thanks to all the TBE congregants who helped with suggestions, their time and in some cases, the installation. The next time you are in Temple, notice our larger, exterior monitoring screen. This larger monitor allows full body viewing of whomever is asking to be admitted. Also, two, solar powered, motion detector, flood lights that have been installed on the front walkway. These should help bring light to the areas our large, outside lights fail to reach.

As I end this month's column, I want to thank Rabbi and Rhonda Karol for their devotion to TBE, our children, the religious school. Their community involvement, has kept TBE's name and presence viable in Las Cruces and surrounding area. With Rabbi's reduced in-temple hours, I will be in the office on Wednesday from noon until 2:00, Thursday from 10:00 until 2:00. - Treasurer informed board that a new ACH protocol was being set up with Citizen's Bank so members can schedule automatic payments of dues.
- Second half of Rabbi's December salary will be paid in early January at Rabbi's request.
- Communications team discussed some modifications to Adelante, including decreasing the number of pages.
- Cheryl and Joanne will go to El Paso on Monday (Dec. 21st) to meet with members of the Foundation regarding our grant request.
- Camp Hope Christmas breakfast Mensch club is renting a 36" griddle.
- Night at the Auction looking for more donations
- Paypal for donations online is not active. Board is considering options.

Temple Beth-El Security Improvements

Through a generous grant from the Jewish Federation of Greater El Paso, Temple Beth-El was provided with \$5,000 which was to be used specifically for security upgrades. As a result of this, the Security Committee of the Board of Trustees has been meeting for several months to consider what safety and security upgrades we might provide for the Temple through this money. Additionally, the committee sought input from congregants and implemented several of those suggestions.

A variety of upgrades have been or are in the process of being made. This article is to fully inform the congregation of what has occurred and what changes you might see around the Temple. Additionally, the Security committee along with the Adult Ed committee are considering providing some brief orientations for congregants about the upgrades.

This is what has been done:

- We have upgraded the security system to use 4G service (like with your cell phone) so that it will never lose contact with the security company even if we lose phone service or internet connectivity;
- The video/audio doorbell has been upgraded so that there is now a 7" monitor mounted on the wall on the left-hand side of the door so that anyone who answers the door can see who is outside:
- There is a new security camera mounted on the wall, near the ceiling in the foyer aimed toward the front
- There are now door reinforcement locks for interior "safe" rooms:
- There are three new first aid kits (one wall-mounted in the kitchen; one wall-mounted in the prayer book room near the defibrillator; and a smaller one in the front office);
- New special clotting gauze; tourniquets;
- Boxes of band-aids in each classroom and front of-
- Solar lights to be installed to more brightly illuminate the front walkway;
- Armed security for High Holidays; rummage sale;
- New locks to be installed on sanctuary doors
- Allied will be putting up signs and more stickers warning of the security monitoring

The Board of Trustees wishes to thank Mark Saltman and the Security committee for their research and implementation of these important safety measures.

Friday- 10:30-11:30 am, 2:00-4:00 pm, and while he is preparing for Shabbat worship.




