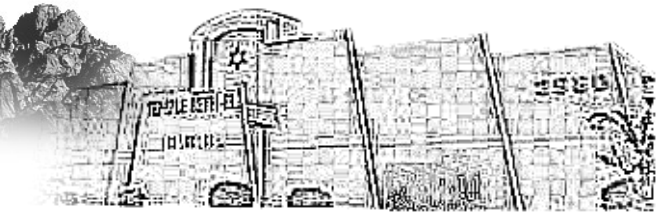

In order to ensure that the name of your loved one will be recited during services, we have instituted the following practices:

- The Hebrew dates for each week's Yahrzeits are listed in each Adelante.
- Names are read on the Shabbat **following** the Yahrzeit, or on the day, if it falls on that Shabbat.
- Hebrew vs. conventional (Gregorian) calendar: The temple's tradition is to base the Yahrzeits list on the Hebrew calendar. Those who wish to have a name read on a Friday night close to the conventional (Gregorian) calendar date are asked to please email or call the Temple office a few days prior to the service.

*Asterisks indicate that a loved one has been permanently memorialized with a plaque in the Temple sanctuary. If you are interested in acquiring a plaque for your loved one, contact the Temple office. Current TBE members may purchase a plaque for \$300. Non TBE members may purchase a plaque for \$600.

ONEG UPDATE

The Sisterhood Council is very thankful to all who responded to the 'Oneg Request' letter we mailed in September.

Several members that are unable or unavailable to host kindly and very generously donated money to 'sponsor' an Oneg in honor or in memory of a loved one, or in appreciation of a special occasion. Several also donated in honor of Rabbi Evette!

However, the number of members who signed up to actually co-host at least two Onegs during the year falls short of our efforts to have hosts for every Friday. Several members have already hosted 3 or 4 onegs, and while that is totally appreciated, we cannot expect a handful of members to continue to do this. Also, at this point in time we do not want to 'hire' outside help to do what should be a joy for members to do.

After much discussion, the Sisterhood Council has decided that, after all attempts to solicit hosts have failed, there will be an occasional "No Host Oneg". Simply put, there will be Challah, wine and grape juice served for the Ha Motzi, and nothing else.

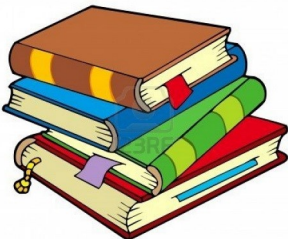

Lately, I have been checking out *The Forward* newspaper on a regular basis. *The Forward* is the English language grandchild of the very popular daily Yiddish paper, *The Forverts*, which was started in 1897 and provided news and advice to tens of thousands of

Yiddish speaking immigrants.

Today, the publication offers a wide range of information and commentary on the most interesting news stories about American Jews and the American Jewish experience. There was an announcement about an online vigil being organized by the Asian American Jewish community near Monterey Park, in response to the very tragic massacre of 12 Asians at a Lunar New Year celebration.

It caught my eye because the vigil was being organized by the Asian American Jewish community nearby. Asian American and Jewish are generally not seen together in the same sentence. It was another realization about the broad diversity now reflected in the Jewish communities around the country.

At one time, the Yiddish *Forverts* served the vast majority of Jewish immigrants arriving and living in America. This was the huge wave of more than a million Jews who poured into the country between 1890 and 1920, who created the stereotype of Jewish Lower East Side, pictures of pushcarts and pickle stores, and literally setting the stage for several generations of comedians, entertainers, musicians, scientists, lawyers, doctors, scholars, and countless others who helped create the American middle class of the 1930s, 1940s and 1950s. For many of us, these were our parents or grandparents, and they are the reason we eat bagels and lox today. This demographic had an indelible impact not only on Jewish culture, but on all of American culture.

But that era of Lower East Side tenements, and young Jewish girls working in sweatshops is long past history. Today, we have a Jewish community filled with ethnic diversity, national diversity, and Jews by choice from every other possible religious background.

Reading about a gathering of the Asian American Jewish community made me think about my friend Myra, who adopted her daughter Sadie from China. Other Jewish families were also adopting daughters from China, and when Sadie had her Bat Mitzvah, young Chinese girls all over New York City were having their Bat Mitzvah celebrations at the same time. I knew of several adopted Korean daughters as well, and all of them identified as Asian American Jews.

There is no question that the tremendous wave of poor Jews from Ukraine and other parts of the Pale

transformed America. But that experience no longer reflects the growing demographic diversity of American Judaism today. It's time for us to learn to use chopsticks along with carving up the brisket!

Temple Beth-El Board of Trustees Meeting Summary, January 19, 2023

- An Invocation was given by Martha Roditti.
- The Board unanimously approved a motion to welcome three new member family units: Joanne Kaufman, Rain Simons, and Jermel and Nicole Griffin.
- Treasurer Joel Siegel presented the Financial Report and indicated we are on track.
- The Board passed a resolution that for the fiscal year of 2023-2024 1% of all the committed dues base will be committed to the Social Action Committee to disburse up to \$500 per tikkun olam opportunity that might arise in the Jewish community at the local, state, regional, national, or international level without further board action. The funds will not carry over year to year.
- Rabbi Evette reported:
 - that working with David Decker there is a weekend planned to help refurbish the temple in Las Vegas, NM.
 - the Martin Luther King weekend events were well attended by temple members.
 - she expressed appreciation for the new microphone she is now using.
 - there will be some upcoming educational programming coming from the Adult Ed Committee and from the Rabbi.
 - she attended a gathering of Faith Leaders to discuss the needs and issues of the unhoused and how we can all supplement that. There may be an opportunity for Mental Health First Aid Training in the near future.
 - she will be the speaker at the Cafe Europa lunch on February 5, 2023.
- Wendee Lorbeer and Dee Cook reported "An Afternoon at the Auction" plans are underway and some interesting auction items are coming in. The event is March 5, 2023.
- President Nan Rubin reported

- a Jewish El Paso Federation grant proposal was submitted to help fund part time work to aid with administration and outreach support.
- there continues to be discussion of holding a scaled down event like the JFFF.
- she will also be contacting a Board Nominating Committee.
- Steve Haydu discussed his plans for a half day, in person, work session for the Board of Trustees which will take place in February.
- Lynn Zeemont indicated that Sisterhood is hoping to hold a Second Night Seder off site. Plans are in the works with more details later.
- Jeff Lewis reported
 - the Mensch Club is growing and has been working hard.
 - there is an upcoming Trivia Afternoon on Sunday, January 22, 2023.
 - a Hockey Game Night on February 18, 2023 in El Paso is planned. -
 - Members continue to help with activities such as the Christmas at Camp Hope and the upcoming weekend in Las Vegas as well as enjoying themselves together at breakfast outings.
