Minutes from Temple Beth-El Board of Trustees Meeting September 19, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 6:07 followed by an invocation by Rabbi Evette Lutman and VP Jeff Lewis. Rabbi Evette, Debbie Levy, Sheri Spiegal, Deb Lendyke, Martha Roditti, Dee Cook, Joel Siegel, Wendee Lorbeer (Zoom), Donna Popky, Jeff Lewis, and Bill Stein were in attendance.

VP Jeff Lewis provided the President's Report on behalf of President Diane Fleishman who was out of town. Jeff reported that the Library Committee will meet, the Constitution Committee is actively meeting, and the Youth Committee is currently active. Jeff proposed that we garner donations for Casa de Peregrinos year-round and will write an article in the Adelante with the request and logistics.

In her Rabbi's Report, Rabbi Evette described a well-attended Shofar across Borders on Zoom, with attendees as far as Brazil. Much of her focus is on preparing for the High Holidays, including many activities. Glenn Phillips will help with sukkah construction again this year. She seeks volunteers for readings, the Religious Practices Committee developed a "Signup Genius" or non-webbased methods for volunteering. On Nov 9, Linda Sweenie and Glenn Philips's band, Shir Balev, will play a fundraiser; Saturday night 9/21/24 is Game Night sponsored by the Youth Group. All are welcome.

Joel Siegel, Treasurer, reported that we are tracking closely to what we planned this year if not slightly ahead, partially due to extraordinary donation for \$10K in July 2024. Yet we are behind because religious school has not yet collected tuition. Seven donations for the Yizkor Book have arrived; deadline is 9/24. A discussion ensued about waiving Religious School tuition to stay competitive with other religious school in town. Joel made a motion to waive RS tuition for one year, to be re-evaluated in June 2025. Wendee seconded the motion. The vote passed unanimously. Religious School families will be encouraged to make donations for supplies and field trips. The Religious School Donation Account can be used to pay expenses this year.

A Membership Report from Deb Lendyke entailed plans to support Charles Kuznikoff to attend High Holiday services with assistance. Nametags for board and all service attendees are forthcoming to advance social networking at TBE. New Member Open House will take place Saturday Oct 19, 6:30-8:30 pm. All are invited to welcome new and prospective members in the sukkah.

There was a request to change the First Friday worship event to Second Friday due to conflicts with arts activities on the first Fridays of each month. First Fridays at TBE are currently scheduled for Oct 18, 2024; Nov 1, 2024. A board member will reach out to First Fridays leaders to discuss and report back.

Ways and Means Committee reported that they are working on ticket sales for the concert on November 9, and the Artisan Marketplace on December 8. Plans for publicity for both are underway.

Regarding infrastructure, Jeff Lewis reported an agreement with a new security firm for three hours for Friday night, three and a half hours on Saturday morning, and three hours on Sundays when school is in session. Call Jeff if you need security, he will do his best to organize it. He also reminded us that false alarms cost a \$300 LCPD fine.

In new business, Debbie Levy asked who is in charge of toilet paper. Mark Singer is taking care of it. Thank you, Mark Singer. A board member needs to be present at every service; Jeff will confirm with the security firm that the board members will be walked to their cars after they lock up. The meeting was adjourned at 7:49 pm

CHANGING HABITS: THINK SMALL

Whether you realize it or not, a lot of your daily behavior is composed of habits. These are automatic behaviors that you do without thinking. You do them in the same way every day. From the moment we open our eyes in the morning, get out of bed, brush our teeth, take a shower, or fix breakfast, we are running on habits.

According to researchers, we can get remarkable results by making one tiny change at a time.

Simplicity changes behavior. When a behavior is easy to do, it doesn't require lots of motivation. Weeding your garden for two minutes requires less motivation than weeding for five hours. Cleaning and putting away a few dishes is easier than cleaning the whole kitchen. Motivation is not reliable. It shifts day by day, even minute by minute.

Here are a few ideas for building habits you want and getting them to work

for you:

- 1. What makes you come alive or fills your heart with joy? Look for a habit that would do just that.
- 2. Stay engaged in this new habit. Our brains LOVE novelty. "Wake up" out of your old habitual programming.
- 3. Create an attitude of gratitude. If you look at changing a habit as something you are grateful for, you have more reason to do it.
- 4. Connect with your purpose. Why am I doing this? Look at the big picture and remember the reason you want this new habit.
- 5. It's the little things that count. "It's the little details that are vital. Little things make big things happen". John Wooden

B. J. Fogg, a Stanford University professor, created a method for designing new habits. He calls it a recipe and it has three parts: Part 1 - After I You connect an already existing routine in your life that will remind you to do the new habit.

Part 2 - I will The new habit you want and make it super tiny and super easy

Part 3 - Then celebrate! Something you do to create a positive feeling inside yourself like a big smile, clap your hands, do a fist pump, give yourself a thumbs-up, tell yourself good job.

Here are several examples:

After you brush your teeth, don't snack anymore. Clap your hands.

After you notice you are feeling stressed, take a few deep breaths. Then congratulate yourself.

After you hear your alarm in the morning, get up without hitting snooze. Then smile.

When you feel successful you'll want to do that habit again. Reflection: Think of one habit that you would like to add to your routine.

Today's Practice: Run the habit through the Recipe: After I.....I will.... And then congratulate yourself. I welcome your comments: gbrave3333@aol.com


