

#### **New Years Letter from Nan Rubin**

Dear Friends,

Six months ago I left Las Cruces and moved into the Boston Home, a specialized nursing facility in Dorchester, a neighborhood of Boston. This is a special place designed specifically for people with MS and other neurological conditions, who also use Power chairs. Imagine 95 people of all ages and physical abilities who are also zipping around inside and outside, up and down the halls in motorized wheelchairs-Welcome to The Boston Home!

The food isn't bad, and they serve cocktails two or three days a week. More than physical care, there are doctors who come here regularly to check on our wounds, our eyes, our feet, our meds, our physical condition and our mental health. There is also an on–site workshop dedicated to keeping our wheelchairs running that can fabricate any special adaptations we might need both to use our communications devices as well as stay mobile.

This is where I live now. It was very difficult for me to leave Las Cruces, but moving here was definitely the right decision and I am finally settling in. My roommate has been here six years, another single woman with no children, and she has been a big help orienting me to the daily routine and helping me remember the names of all the aides and staff who help us. (There are four women named Mary; six women named Marie; and two named Maria. Plus, on my hallway there are two residents named Elizabeth, two residents named Mark, and two residents named Nancy. Adding "Nan" has not been easy!)

Activities vary. There is a painting group, two writing groups, people who play cribbage and Scrabble, outings, and many musicians who come in to perform.

But one of the most satisfying opportunities here is the chance to be involved with research projects. I was asked to be the subject of a project by a team of engineering students at Northeastern, who were designing a wheelchair device to remind us all periodically to tilt back in our chairs (an important function for people sitting in wheelchairs all day). Their professor thought they did a terrific job figuring out how to provide us with visual and audio signals, and I had fun playing with the gyroscope attached to my chair.


I have also been accepted in a Stage 2 Study of MRIs of people with MS, conducted by a neurological institute in Buffalo. They have paired up MS residents from The Boston Home with a similar group from Buffalo and will compare our brain scans to identify various stages of the disease –if they can. In addition to being scanned in a tiny MRI they brought, while they were here the Buffalo people gave us a battery of cognitive tests. When they have some results, I will be eager to find out how my brain is working both inside and out.

To keep myself busy, along with the only other Jewish resident we prepared a presentation about Hanukkah

which was very well attended. I have also put together a small ad hoc group of new residents (though at six months I am no longer a 'newbie') to draft an FAQ with some basic logistical information about The Boston Home that will help new residents get oriented, such as the different basic responsibilities of the aides and nurses, and how to have your name put on new clothes before you send them to the laundry. We have received nothing but positive encouragement for this project so I hope we can complete it early in the new year.







