- Names are read on the Shabbat **following** the Yahrzeit, or on the day, if it falls on that Shabbat.
- Hebrew vs. conventional (Gregorian) calendar: The temple's tradition is to base the Yahrzeits list on the Hebrew calendar. Those who wish to have a name read on a Friday night close to the conventional (Gregorian) calendar date are asked to please email admin@tbelc.org or call the Temple office.

*Asterisks indicate that a loved one has been permanently memorialized with a plaque in the Temple sanctuary. If you are interested in acquiring a plaque for your loved one, contact the Temple office. Current TBE members may purchase a plaque for \$360. Non TBE members may purchase a plaque for \$600.

Mid-Year Financial Report from the Treasurer

At the end of January 2025, Temple Beth-El's financial outlook is favorable relative to our beginning of year (July 1, 2024) budgeted deficit of \$60,000 but nevertheless still ending in a deficit. This means that we project that the June 30, 2025 cumulative P&L will be less negative, and the cash balance less diminished, than projection barring any unforeseen extraordinary expense and with the expectation that pledges and donations will stay on track. How much better? There are many variables, but the expectation is on the order of 10 to 40 thousand dollars less negative P&L and less diminished cash balance than the \$60,000 budgeted deficit.

Our current full year pledge dues base vs. budget for 2024-2025 is now \$136,015 vs. \$136,400 budgeted, a projected shortfall. Do note however that the budget represents the 10% dues increase suggested at the start of the fiscal year, so this can be interpreted as having almost met the dues increase challenge.

At the end of January 2025, pledge income is about at expectation. There is about \$23,100 more to be collected through end of June.

General Fund donations are ahead of expectation owing in part to due to a number of extraordinary donations totaling over \$36,000. These donations are the largest single factor making for a surplus relative to budget through January. Among them are single donations of \$10,000, \$8,000, \$6,500, \$5,000, \$4,500, and two of \$1,000.

The only budgeted Ways and Means fundraiser this year is the silent auction. Unplanned fundraisers, the Shir Balev concert, and the Artisan market, are additional factors making for a surplus relative to budget through January. A Comedy Night is also planned. Thanks to all who organized and made these events a success.

We will enter FY 2025-2026 on July 1, 2025 budgeting for a reduced spiritual leader salary package. This should help TBE to achieve a balanced or near-balanced budget.

Our Schwab investment account is not a part of our operating funds. It is a separate account that might be considered a reserve. Money has not been needed or taken from this account for the last three years. Its balance is \$295,000.

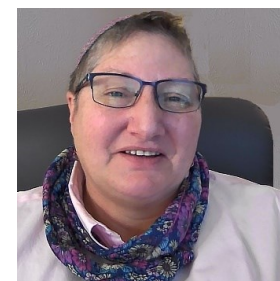
Please know that your Board places the highest value on your input as we envision our future together at Temple Beth-El, Las Cruces.

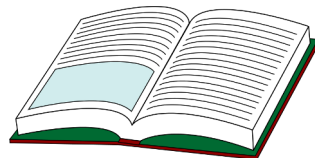
