To this end, we are inviting every temple member to attend one of three meetings in April where we will walk through a targeted process to help us explore our congregational values and goals. We are calling this initiative Your Voice – Our Future; the process and questions will be identical in each meeting, so please choose to attend the one that's most convenient for you.

We will also host a separate Zoom session for those unable to attend in person. We truly need to hear from everyone to ensure our congregation can navigate the changes ahead and move forward with confidence and a clear vision.

One final thought as we begin this change journey together. I'd like to suggest that we practice something called "radical kindness." What I mean by this is in all our interactions with each other, we need to keep the notion of kindness top-of-mind. Even when someone isn't particularly nice to you. ### Board Meeting Summary March 20, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 pm. In attendance: Donna Popky, Mark Singer, Rabbi Evette Lutman, Lynn Zeemont, Bill Stein, Joel Siegel, Deb Leyndyke, Sheri Spiegal, Martha Roditti.

Diane Fleishman provided an invocation to remember Dee Cook, mentor, friend, Temple historian, and a matriarch of the congregation in the last many years. May her memory be for a blessing.

Steve Haydu visited to discuss updates to the Constitution, after merging the Constitution and By-laws. Minor changes were discussed. The Constitution Committee will invite congregants to view and ask questions about the new version, ahead of a congregational vote for ratification.

**President's report:** Annual Meeting May 22, 2025. Committees to be filled ASAP: Budget & Nominating. Board appointees to be filled: Sisterhood Liaison, new Treasurer.

Rabbi's report: Rabbi has been supporting a homeless community member via funds and moral support; discussion on best way to continue support. Idea: invite for Passover seder. Dispute in Jewish community about Palestinian and Israeli conflicts. Senate Bill SB0195, preventing Antisemitic Discrimination in New Mexico, is currently pending before the Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee. Found out at last minute before the vote thanks to the Berksons. Lack of Jewish federation in NM contributes to lack of timely awareness on such legislative issues particular to New Mexico. Rabbi asked Jeff Steinborn for guidance on whether / how we can express support.

**Treasurer report:** This year we will be in the red 20-50k instead of 60k. If we had a silent auction, it would bring in half of what was normally raised at our auction event which was impossible to pull off.

Committee reports: Sheri passed around a printout of committee reports from Library, Sisterhood, Youth Group, Social Action, and Biblical Garden. Biblical Garden updated webpage and donation form to facilitate donations to commemorate Dee Cook's many contributions. Jeff Lewis provided updates on the Mensch Club's social events and services to the temple.

**New Business:** Memorial / celebration of life of Dee Cook in partnership with the Berksons and Paul Kramer. Mark Singer is getting a quote for parking lot repairs. Upcoming informational meetings to envision future of congregation, led by Linda Sweenie.

### Focaccia Bread Making

Teacher Abby Rothman assisted by Alison Mann, taught focaccia bread making to 8 TBE women on March 9th and 10th.

Lynn Zeemont expressed everyone's amazement at how easy it was to produce a fabulous bread saying, "Even I can do this!"




