Join us on July 20, 2025, from 2 to 4 PM at Temple Beth-El to learn about New Mexico's healthcare crisis and how you can help improve access to quality medical care.

This informative training session is sponsored by the Social Action Committee and presented by Patients Primero.

The goals of Patients Primero---a nonpartisan citizens group that grew out of the Listening Sessions presented by the Doña Ana County Medical Society---are to:

- ☐ Educate voters about what's driving the shortage of medical providers.
- $\hfill\Box$  Create partnerships to advocate for improved access to quality health care, and
- ☐ Collaborate with legislators to enact comprehensive, sustainable legislation that will attract and retain healthcare professionals.

Come learn about Patients Primero and the factors driving New Mexico's provider shortage. You'll also learn about legislative actions that can improve recruitment and retention, and how you can get involved to advocate for change when the State Legislative Health and Human Services Committee comes to Las Cruces in September.

#### "When We Sing, We Pray Twice"

This quote is usually attributed to St. Augustine, who understood that adding melody to our prayers elevates them by imbuing our words with beautiful sound that compels us to join our voices together communally. From June 8th-12th I was able to live these words in the presence of my professional community, the Women Cantors' Network, at our yearly conference which was held this year in Louisville, KY. The WCN was established 43 years ago by the then handful of female cantors serving congregations here in the United States. In a decidedly male dominated field, these women were made to feel unwelcome at professional conferences and meetings, so turned to each other for support and guidance. Over the years, the organization has grown as more and more women pursue careers as Jewish music professionals. It has expanded to include members from the three major North American movements (Reform, Conservative, Reconstructionist), and today, though we still have the word "Women" in our title because if its historical significance, we maintain a gender-diverse membership of nearly 300 from around the world. Like every year, I returned from the conference, my head filled with new music, new worship approaches, creative teaching techniques and so much more. I am excited to begin sharing all of this with you when I begin my interim position on August 1st. By continuing to join our voices together in prayer and


Should you need anything from the gift shop over the summer just call Lenore at 575-888-4644 and set up an appointment to come in and browse or shop early for the Holidays.


