Non TBE members may purchase a plaque for \$600.

Seeds in the Ashes

-A year in allegory by Meir Ashan (art by Robert Kitcey)

Beneath the palace walls, lies a village where ordinary lives are made from extraordinary moments. Farmers, merchants, shepherds, and watchmen write their lives among the fields and rows. These are their stories — tales woven of soil, silence, and song, within each season is sown a hidden truth for any with the eyes to see.

For Tishrei: "The Watchman's Burden"



Shimon's name meant one who hears, and indeed, he heard more than most. From his regular post upon the city wall, he caught every creak of timber, every flutter of wings, every murmur carried on the wind. Yet what reached his heart most was not sound but silence—the silence between calls, where

danger might be hiding.

It was the time of harvest, when caravans streamed back through the gates, laden with seasonal grain and fruit, song and laughter. Families reunited, friends embraced. But Shimon's eyes never rested.

His grip on the spear was so tight that his knuckles ached. He thought not of joy but of the hidden thief, the lurking blade, the danger that might slip past his watch.

Below him, Orli danced. Her name meant my light, and she embodied it fully. She spun barefoot among the carts, chasing the golden chaff the wind tossed like sparks.

Her laughter was as bright as the sun flashing on bronze vessels.

"Orli!" Shimon called down sharply. "Away from the gates. Do you not see the risk? One careless step could undo us all."

Orli only paused, head tilted, eyes wide. "I see only the people coming home."

Her words unsettled him. He turned back to the horizon, but her laughter lingered in his ears.

That evening, as shadows stretched long, Shimon made his final round. And there, by the open gate, he saw the King himself—not robed, not crowned, not flanked by guards. Clad in simple garments, the King embraced weary travelers, lifted children onto his knee, spoke with strangers as though kin. The gate stood wide; still, the King bore no fear.

Shimon's spear felt heavier than ever, as though it no longer belonged in his hand. That night, he set it aside. For the first time in months, he closed his eyes and slept.

At dawn, Shimon walked beyond the walls. In the fields, booths of reeds and branches had been raised, roofs thin enough that stars

could be seen through them. Families gathered beneath their fragile shelters, eating bread, grapes, and figs. Children darted in and out, laughter spilling like water from a jar.

Orli tugged at his sleeve. "Come sit in ours. You can see the sky through the leaves."

Shimon ducked inside. The air was cool; sunlight dappled the ground through woven branches. Looking upward, he saw the vastness of the heavens above the fragile roof. He had always trusted stone, yet here, in the thin shade of reeds, he felt strangely secure.

Outside, Miriam the water-bearer—her name meaning bitterness turned to song— made her rounds with heavy jars. Shimon offered to carry one, but she shook her head. "Each bears their share, but each is forgiven their stumble." She smiled, and he thought of the harsh words he had spoken to neighbors, sharp as his spear. For the first time, he wondered if forgiveness might protect better than vigilance.

Later, Dinah, the merchant whose name meant judgment, joined the dancers in the field. For once she left her ledgers closed, her measures forgotten. She spun with abandon, laughter scattering like seeds on the wind. Shimon watched, realizing joy itself was a shield against despair.

At twilight, the King entered the booths one by one, eating bread with bakers, drinking water with shepherds, letting children climb into his lap. His presence carried no dread, only a deep, unspoken trust.

Shimon approached, heavy still with doubt.

"My lord," he said softly, "if the gate stands open, what if danger comes?"

The King looked at him with eyes as steady as dusk. "Every open gate invites risk. But if you close it, you shut out not only enemies but friends. Walls protect, yet the open fields sustain."

The words sank into Shimon's heart like seed into tilled soil. He bowed his head, and at last he understood: his burden had been heavier than the wall itself, for it was built of fear without trust.

That night, he lay again beneath a roof of reeds. He saw the stars through its gaps and felt no dread. He dreamed of caravans returning, voices of welcome at gates wide open. He dreamed of Orli dancing.

The days that followed found Shimon still walking the walls, but differently. His eyes sought not only shadows but lanterns returning home. His ears listened not only for threats but for songs carried on the wind. And when Orli danced by the gates, he did not scold her. He found himself smiling, hearing in her laughter the birth of something new—fragile as a reed roof, enduring as the stars.




Linda would like to be informed when someone goes to the hospital, and when someone is confined to their home and would like a visit from her. And she always wants to be contacted if there is a death among our congregational family. She also always welcomes people making an appt. to see her at the Temple for assistance.

Sometimes people will say, "I was in the hospital for three weeks and no one from the Temple came to visit," but there's a good chance that no one from the Temple knew they were in the hospital! There are also times when people who are ill don't wish for a visit, so if you are a friend who wants to tell the congregation, asking the ill person if they wish to have the Temple contacted is a respectful question.

The Mitzvah team will also visit ill people if asked and will contact Linda if there is a request to do so. If rides are needed to Temple events or services, or to doctors' appointments, etc. the Mitzvah team will make every effort to get someone to drive. We've been asked to accompany people to a doctor's appointment when there needs to be an extra listening ear, and occasionally we've made food for congregants who require that for a brief time. We depend on our fellow congregants to help meet the Mitzvah requests, and we are grateful when they can help.





Bricks for the Biblical Garden and Brick Walkway
